Marilyn Gets Final Decree From DiMaggio

Marilyn Monroe and Joe DiMaggio are finally divorced.

The glamour queen's attorney, Jerry Giesler, appeared yesterday in the chambers of Superior Judge Elmer D. Doyle, who signed the final decree of the divorce she obtained a year ago, Oct. 28.

"What are the chances of a reconciliation?" queried the judge, smiling.

"That's gone by the boards. The time has passed," Giesler answered lightly.

"Does she have any marriage plans?" the lawyer was asked.

"I don't know about marriage. I only know about divorce," Giesler declared.

Now in New York

The judgment, ending last year's marriage for Miss Monroe and the famed baseball player, was taken by messenger to the Hall of Records and filed.

It stated for the world to know that Norma Jeane DiMaggio and Joseph Paul DiMaggio, who were married Jan. 14, 1954, separated Sept. 27, 1954, and were divorced by first decree Oct. 28, 1954, are no longer husband and wife and that "the bonds of matrimony be and are dissolved."

The blond star was reported to be in New York, attending acting school. DiMaggio was also said to be in New York, on business.

She divorced him in the courtroom of Superior Judge Orlando H. Rhodes in Santa Monica on testimony that the sports idol had treated her with "coldness and indifference" when she had expected "love, warmth and affection."
