Miss Monroe Becomes Bride of Playwright

Marilyn Monroe and Playwright Arthur Miller were married yesterday in the White Plains (N.Y.) City Hall by City Judge Seymour Rabinowitz.

The decision to have the marriage performed in White Plains apparently was a spur-of-the-moment agreement made while the couple were motoring back from a vacation in Connecticut.

Witnesses at the ceremony were Miller's cousin, Morton A. Miller, and his wife Florence of Roxbury, Ct.

Associate Also Present

Milton Green, a business associate of Marilyn, was also present.

The bride wore a cardigan sweater and skirt. Miller was dressed in a blue linen suit. He did not wear a tie.

Judge Rabinowitz said Miller indicated he borrowed the ring he slipped on Marilyn's finger. Miller, he said, remarked that he would later

replace the ring used in ceremony.

The couple looked tired, but happy, Judge Rabinowitz said.

After the brief civil ceremony Marilyn and her new bridegroom continued on toward New York.

It was Marilyn's third marriage and his second.

Miller earlier had said their wedding date would be announced — after it happened. But neither he nor Marilyn intimated when it would take place.

The news conference was held earlier at the home of the Morton Millers in Roxbury, about 50 miles from White Plains. Marilyn told newsmen she wanted a "very quiet" wedding. And while gazing at Miller with adoration she said they definitely planned to have children.

She said she planned to continue her movie career. Miller said he approved.

"She is a very good actress and she is going to get better all the time," he said.
